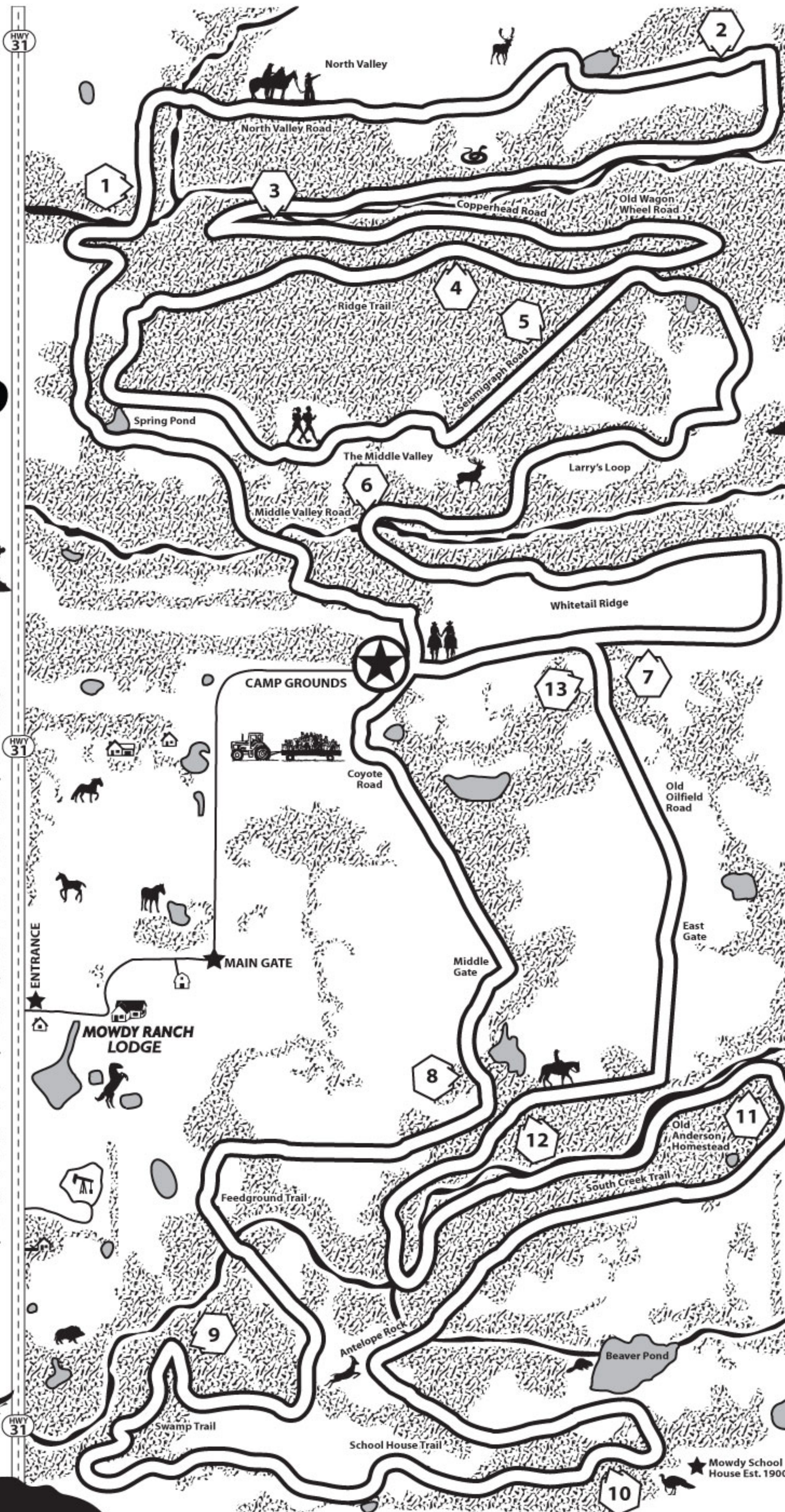
The Mowdy Ranch Horse Camp event takes place on Mowdy Ranch, which is located 12 miles NE of Coalgate, Oklahoma. Trail Riders will navigate dirt roads and trails up the rocky hills and down into the heavily wooded creek bottoms. The wild horses will be moved to adjacent pastures but they will be visible to the riders. Ride with fellow equestrians through the diverse landscape that these majestic animals call home. All proceeds from the horse camp are donated to the continued care and maintenance of these beautiful animals, the wild Mustangs. Millions of these wild horses once roamed this country, but the press of civilization now limits the land available for these horses. When their numbers get too great, the BLM is forced to capture and move horses to ranches like Mowdy Ranch where they are allowed to live and run free for the rest of their lives. Unfortunately ranches willing to take these beautiful horses are few and limited. Your help is needed to insure the continued existence of the wild mustangs.

These trails have plenty of rocks, roots, stumps and other hazards. There are stream crossings and many other natural obstructions that will be traversed. The trails are narrow at times and will require everyone to ride in single file. Nature trail hikes will follow these same trails and of course don't forget to adopt a Wild Mustang.

**MOWDY RANCH Mustangs**

Mowdy Ranch is the Bureau of Land Management's (BLM)'s second wild horse eco-sanctuary in the United States open to tourism. Located 12 miles NE of Coalgate in the hills of southeastern Oklahoma, Mowdy Ranch is now offering daily photographic tours and lodging facilities for wild horse enthusiasts. Mowdy Ranch comprises 4000 acres of wooded hills and open valleys in southeastern Oklahoma, the historical home of the legendary Choctaw ponies. The Choctaw ponies were famous for their toughness and endurance which was showcased in the film "Hidalgo". Mowdy Ranch has now dedicated 1280 acres of the ranch as a wild mustang eco-sanctuary and currently houses 153 wild horses on a long term basis. Mowdy Ranch is owned by Clay and Kit Mowdy whose children are the fifth generation to live and work on the ranch. The ranch has two lodges which are capable of sleeping up to 32 people and has kitchen and dining facilities which can accommodate larger groups and special events.
